Children in Need 20th November

In addition there will be a Tutor Group Competition leading up to the event with a prize for the Tutor Group who collects the most objects towards the Christmas Fair. This is a great opportunity for you and your family to turn out those items that are in good condition but you have never liked, or never used!

The Christmas Fair is always a successful event and has been very well supported by students, families and members of the wider community. All details will be available on the website and on a flier which will be brought home by your child. We look forward to seeing you there again this year.
