In any event, those days are hopefully behind us, at least for another 12 months, and we turn our attention now to the present and the future.

This is of course the time of year when our Year 11 students are preparing in earnest for their GCSE and other KS4 examinations. On behalf of the staff and governors I would like to wish our Year 11 students, who will be revising and preparing during the Easter holidays and beyond, all the very best for their forthcoming examinations. At this point I would like to remind parents of the availability of "SAM Learning", an interactive learning tool which is accessible to all students and is designed ultimately to enhance their performance in examinations.

School Population

I was very pleased to learn recently that we will be welcoming another full year group in our Year 7 intake for September 2010. In fact, we are now oversubscribed in this year group and this is the first time that this has happened for very many years. I am delighted that Harrow Way is increasingly the first choice for families in our area. We are fully committed to a cycle of continuous improvement in order to make the Harrow Way School Community increasingly effective and efficient and we are looking forward to working closely with our new students and families from next September. From next year, therefore, the whole school will be virtually full and this means that we are increasingly able to exploit the economies of scale that this provides in order to offer outstanding curriculum and wider opportunities to all our students.

Artsmark Gold

It was wonderful news for us last term when Ofsted reported that we are "a good school with many outstanding features". We are also proud holders of the prestigious Artsmark Gold Award which is granted for a period of three years. We have recently gone through the application process seeking redesignation with the Arts Council and are awaiting their decision imminently.

Staff

This term we have said goodbye to two colleagues, Miss Vicky Thompson and Mr Martin Cunningham. Miss Thompson joined us over two years ago as a Teacher of English and will be taking up a post in Basingstoke to further her experience. Mr Cunningham has been employed as a Science Technician again for over two years and will be leaving us to enjoy retirement. We wish both Miss Thompson and Mr Cunningham all the very best for the future.

As the school continues to expand we are of course appointing significantly more staff than we are losing, and we have been very busy this term and expect to be so next term, appointing new teaching and support staff for September. Full details of those staff joining us in September will be provided in the Summer edition of Head's Corner. In the meantime, I am delighted to announce that we have appointed three new colleagues who will be joining us after Easter. These are: Miss Sarah Hutchins to the post of Extended Services Co-ordinator to replace Kim Francis who left us last term; following the departure of Kelly Mead from the post of Receptionist we have appointed both Mrs Tracey Freemantle and Mrs Nicola Farrelly. We look forward to welcoming our new colleagues very shortly.

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Premises

We continue to maintain and make improvements to the school site both internally and externally. We will be busy during the coming months installing new lockers for our additional students, as well as creating additional classroom and office spaces around the building.

Community

We fully embrace the notion of "the outward looking school" and are always looking for ways in which we can work closely with and in support of our local community. I am particularly proud of the many partnerships we enjoy with other organisations and also of course of the superb work of Andover Adult and Family Learning, a hugely important group that makes a great contribution to our families in Andover. One of the ways in which Harrow Way extends its reach into the community is through our work in the Expressive and Performing Arts (hence our Artsmark Gold Award) and we were all bowled over recently by the school's production of 'Dracula Spectacula'. This was a typically ambitious show not just in terms of the performance itself, which was fantastic, but also owing to the highly complex technical demands of the production. Mr John Baxter, Head of Performing Arts and the show's Director, first produced Dracula Spectacula in 1983 and it was great to see that some of the students taking part are children of the original cast members, some of whom also came to see the show!

Another important part of the community work of the school is the contribution made by the Harrow Way Community School Association (HWCSA). HWCSA organises and runs many events on behalf of the school in order to raise money and to support the school community.

One of the outstanding qualities of our school community is the way in which our students join together in their support for others less fortunate than ourselves both here and across the world. Examples of their community spirit, expressed through the work of our active and committed
