I am delighted to publish this, my 21st edition of Head's Corner, having been Headteacher here for seven years. Harrow Way Community School is a great place to work and I take enormous pride in the successes of our school throughout the community and particularly of our students and all that they achieve. This year's examination season is now behind us and we await the publication of our GCSE and other Key Stage 4 exam results at the end of August. Results day is Thursday 25th August and we look forward to seeing our Year 11 leavers on that day as they anxiously open their results envelopes. Results will be distributed between 10.00 am and 12.00 pm. We hope to be publishing some excellent results for Harrow Way students on the day.

It is only as we approach the end of the school year and look back on the previous 12 months that one realises just how much goes on in a busy and successful community school. Early in the school year, and following on from our successful Ofsted Inspection we welcomed Mr John Kennedy HMI, who wanted to learn more about our "outstanding" safeguarding procedures. Subsequently, the school's work in this area has been published as part of a national good practice guide for schools. Other events during the school year include numerous daytime and evening events such as "collapsed timetable days" for students to pursue the many commitments that we make which support the formal curriculum and their wider education.

The major curriculum development this year has been our preparation for the introduction of our 3 year KS4 curriculum which begins for all of our Year 9 students in September. Through our robust advice and guidance system, as well as our traditionally available subjects, these students now have access to courses that were previously only available to them at Year 10 and beyond. Examples of these include GCSE Health & Social Care and Law. In addition, subjects brand new to the school are being introduced in September, including GCSE Latin.

As the school and its community grows and develops we will be welcoming another full Year 7 cohort of 180 students in September and we look forward to working with them and their families for the next five years.

Student News

We recently appointed Matthew Pugh and Ella Howells to the positions of Head Boy and Head Girl for the next 12 months. Their respective Deputies are Hallam Doney and Lydia Moulding. These students did exceptionally well to secure these positions within a very high quality field.

In addition to these appointments, I would also like to congratulate our entire team of Prefects and Senior

Prefects, our Peer Mentors, our Unicef Peer Educators and also students taking Leadership roles within our huge number of sporting and competition engagements under the direction of our School Sport Co-ordinator, Miss Rhonda Sturges. They have already made a huge impact and have given up their time freely, not just in relation to their responsibilities in school, but in a number of other high profile events and activities.

On Monday this week we held our Key Stage 3 presentation evening, celebrating the achievements of very many students in Years 7, 8 and 9. Of course, this is the last event quite like this because, as indicated above, from September students will be beginning their KS4 studies in Year 9.

Other events held during these final days of term have included the BTEC Music Summer Concert, the BTEC Drama and Dance Evening and Sports Day. As I write this article I am looking forward to attending Portway Junior School's

Summer Tea Party later this week. This is an opportunity for members and friends of The Portway Junior School community to celebrate the very many successes of the school and to say goodbye for the summer break, and I am pleased to have been invited by Mr Tim Deery, Headteacher at Portway Junior School, to join them for this event.

Gifted and Talented Students

Our Gifted and Talented Students Programme has continued to develop during the year. The member of staff with responsibility for the development of this important area, Mr Essop, has, along with assistance from various colleagues, organised a number of very successful events for these able students. In addition to our provision for Harrow Way students, we organise a number of events during the year for Gifted & Talented students who attend one of our cluster of primary schools. For example, this year we have welcomed pupils from Portway, Knights Enham, Kimpton and Appleshaw schools in order to participate in a wide range of subject based enrichment activities designed to challenge them and promote their learning. We have significant and increasing numbers of more able students at Harrow Way, particularly as the school has grown so rapidly, and we place great importance on the challenge and motivation we are able to provide for them.

Staff

As is usual for the end of a term and academic year, we will be saying goodbye to a number of colleagues either through retirement or because they have secured positions elsewhere. In addition, we will be welcoming new staff in September and indeed some

Sports Partnerships



Please note the school year begins for all students on Wednesday 7th September at 8.45 am.


