

SCHOOL UNIFORM

All our students are expected to wear uniform. There are a number of reasons why we strictly enforce this. In the long run it is cheaper for parents, since it discourages competition in the latest fashion, which can prove expensive. The uniform helps to maintain an identity for the school and a good reputation in the neighbourhood and has been designed to be suitable for all types of school work.

Girls:

*Black school jacket with sewn-in logo (only available from the school).

White short- or long-sleeved shirt or blouse with *school tie.

Plain black skirt (length conforming to standards of decency) or black trousers.

Plain dark socks or dark tights (socks or tights must be worn)

Black shoes (see below)

Scarves, if worn, must be plain black

Girls' PE Uniform:

Short-sleeved red polo shirt

Navy blue sports shorts

White socks and trainers

For all PE and Games activities, students with long hair should provide themselves with hair ties or clips to keep hair off the face.

Boys:

*Black school jacket with sewn-in logo.

White short- or long-sleeved shirt with *school tie.

Plain black trousers

Plain dark socks and Black shoes

Scarves, if worn, must be plain black

Boys' PE Uniform:

Short-sleeved red polo shirt

Navy blue sports shorts

Navy blue football socks

Trainers

Football boots

Girls' and Boys' PE Uniform:

Optional: For outside or cold weather, a dark blue/black tracksuit with minimal logos may be worn.

* Green aprons for Design and Technology: Food

Items marked * may only be purchased from the School Uniform office.

For both Boys and Girls:

White shirts may be short or long sleeved. They must have a collar designed to accommodate a tie. The top button must be done up and the tie tied properly at all times. Shirts may be tailored (fitted) or loose, but they must be of sufficient length to be tucked in. Casual trousers, denim, leathers and 'hoodies' are NOT allowed. Outer coats and scarves should be plain black, green or grey with no badges, and they are not to be worn in the classroom. Shoes must be black, low heeled and of a sensible design. Trainers and other casual footwear are not allowed; this includes trainer-type shoes (hybrid trainer/shoes).

The correct school uniform should be worn at all times, including on the way to and from school.

Jewellery

The wearing of jewellery, with the exception of watches and a small ear stud (no more than one per ear), is not permitted. No other facial or body jewellery is allowed. Facial piercings are unacceptable.

Students and parents should be aware that if we feel that the amount or nature of jewellery worn by an individual student is inappropriate or unreasonable, he or she will be expected to remove it.

Hair

Extreme styles are not acceptable (e.g. inappropriate colouring, etc.) Students should not wear excessive make-up or coloured nail varnish. In such cases students will be expected to remove it.
