

Head's Corner Christmas 2011

I am very pleased to publish my first contribution to Head's Corner as Acting Headteacher during Charlie Currie's secondment for two terms to Brighton Hill Community College in Basingstoke. I am very proud that the Local Authority felt that Harrow Way had the strength of leadership to be able to cope without him for two terms, and I think it is a recognition and vindication of all the hard work that Mr Currie and all the staff have done in recent years.

As usual, this has been a very busy term that has flown by. There have been a number of successful Performing Arts Events including Macbeth and the Music Show, and our musicians and actors are busy preparing for special performances taking place in the last week of term. We have also had the official opening of our new climbing wall and the students are already benefiting from this wonderful facility which will also be open for community use.

Other events this term have included our annual Presentation Evening in November. This is always a highlight of the year for me as we celebrate the successes and achievements of last year's Year 11 students. Once again our inclusive ethos was to the fore, as we recognised a wide variety of outstanding personal achievements, sometimes against the odds. Our guest speaker for the evening was Richard Scriven from Andover Rotary Club and he gave a very motivational speech to us all. We have strong links with Rotary through the Youth Speaks, Young Chef and the World Health Day events in which we participate.

Last week we held our sixth Christmas Fayre and it was wonderful to see so many of our parents and students taking part. This year it was combined with a non-uniform day and our Student Council had decided to support four good causes with the money raised: Children in Need, Woofability, Movember and the Performing Arts Fund. In all, a total of £1,200 was raised and I am particularly grateful to our Senior Prefects who did a great job in running the various stalls.

As we continue to strive for the UNICEF Level 2 award as a Rights Respecting School, Mrs Delany and the UNICEF Peer Educators organised a collection of items for Andover Food Bank and the Armed Forces in Afghanistan. The response from the students was overwhelming and the project culminated in assemblies taken by serving members of the Armed Forces who gave us a great insight into life on the front line and how morale-boosting it was for troops to receive our parcels.

School Population

Our full Year 7 cohort of 180 students has made a brilliant start to their time at Harrow Way. As usual, the excellent transition programme along with our close partnerships with families has enabled them to settle in to our routines without difficulty. Early indications are that we will again be full next September and I, too, acknowledge the trust that the families of Andover are placing in us.

<u>Uniform</u>

The vast majority of our students adhere fully to our uniform requirements but as we approach Christmas and the cold weather, may I remind readers that hoodies or hoodietype garments are not allowed in school and nor is leather or denim clothing permitted. Outer coats should be dark in colour without heavy logos and parents are asked to ensure that any scarves worn by students are plain black. In addition to this may I remind parents that the only items of jewellery permitted are one small stud per ear and a watch. No other facial piercing of any kind is allowed and make-up should be kept to a minimum.

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Attendance and Welfare

We are always looking at ways to improve attendance and punctuality at school and this term has seen the successful introduction of an automatic lunchtime detention for students who arrive late without good reason. The result of this has seen us reduce the number of students late by approximately 50% when compared to this time last year. I am very grateful to members of the Senior Leadership Team for running these detentions. May I also remind parents that whilst all applications for leave of absence are considered individually, it is not normally possible to agree to this for students in Key Stage 4, particularly given the amount of Controlled Assessments and Modular Examinations that take place throughout the year.

<u>Staff</u>

During the term we said goodbye to Mrs Sylvia Morrison, Food Technology Technician and Lunchtime Supervisor, who had been with us for eight years. At the end of this term we are saying goodbye to Mr James Clarke, Teacher of ICT, who is taking up a post in Portsmouth and Mrs Vicky Bentley, Teacher of History, who is taking up the post of SENCO at a school near Basingstoke. I would like to thank them for their work at Harrow Way and wish them every success in the future. We have welcomed Mrs Kelly Murphy as Food Technology Technician and after Christmas we shall be welcoming Mr Alain Ndabala to the ICT Department and Miss Katy Bosworth to the History Department.

There will be a significant number of Information, Advice and Guidance events over the next term or so for parents and students in both Years 8 and 9 as we endeavour to ensure they are on appropriate pathways to future success. These will start with two evenings for year 9 Parents, the first on Tuesday 10th January at school and the second on Wednesday 11th January at "The Lights" theatre in town, about which you will be receiving more information shortly.

I would personally like to thank all members of our school community for their outstanding support for me during this transitional term and I wish you all a very happy Christmas and a prosperous and peaceful New Year.

PLANNED ABSENCE - HOLIDAY FORMS

The Educational Psychology team is offering consultation sessions with two psychologists to discuss your concerns, clarify issues and together generate possible courses of action. We will only be able to discuss school-related issues when a parent and a member of school staff attend together. This will be a joint problem-solving session, not a route to educational psychology assessment. It is not usually helpful for the child to be present especially if the concern relates to behaviour management. If you think you might bring your child, please discuss this by phone in advance of your appointment.
