Kidnapped by pirates, left on a remote island, Hanna and Ned have to survive... and rescue their parents.




# Paolini, Christopher Eragon


### Paver, Michelle Wolf Brother

#### Shan, Darren The Graveyard Book




#### Muchamore, Robert The Recruit
