It gives me great pleasure to introduce myself as the new Head Teacher of Harrow Way Community School. I am delighted to have been appointed and will work tirelessly to promote the best interests of all students, staff and the local community. I would like to thank Mark Warren for leading the school over the last year and Charlie Currie for the wonderful job he has done in moving the school forward.

I have been a teacher for over 20 years and been fortunate to have worked in three diverse and inspiring schools in my career. For the last 10 years I have worked as Deputy Head Teacher at Eggar's School in Alton, Hampshire where I also undertook an 18 month temporary post as Associate Head Teacher. In 2009 Eggar's was graded outstanding in all categories by Ofsted and last year we achieved the highest GCSE results and value added score of any school in Hampshire. Since 2005, I have also been a qualified Ofsted inspector and this year was designated a Specialist Leader of Education.

As we have seen in the build up to the London Olympics, it is important to aim high and I intend to take the school even further over the next few years.
