THE PARK IS OPEN

Jurassic World has recently roared its way into cinemas but does it live up to the original? The answer is yes, but maybe not for the reasons you might have imagined. Jurassic World has been marketed as a sequel to the original trilogy but it acts more like a remake of the original, so much so you can see the direct parallels between the story narratives. I get that they are paying homage to the original but then it makes you question whether this sequel/ remake was necessary just to indulge in pop culture references.

The director did the best he could with what he had and I cannot fault the look of the film, especially as every frame is beautifully shot and rendered and there are some outstanding sequences sure to rival the iconography of the original. I had the privilege of seeing both Jurassic World and the original 1992 movie in IMAX 3D and in some ways it made me respect what they are trying to do with Jurassic World. The point is if you are going to get the most out of this movie, you need to approach it as if it is a separate entity to the original. Saying that, something which really took me out of the film was the product placement: the only thing that was not destroyed in the park was the Starbucks, McDonalds and Coca Cola stand! I mean, they might as well have pasted the Mercedes badge over the Jurassic World logo and it wouldn't have looked out of place. However, one thing that really brings you back into the rich world is John Williams' classic score, which is guaranteed to bring out your inner fan boy/girl.

Coming of the back of 'Guardians of the Galaxy' Chris Pratt is doing the best with the material he has but one thing that undermines his performance is the forced romance he has with Bryce Dallas Howard's character, plus some of the subplots really slow down the pace of the overall story. Yes, it is better than the past two Jurassic Park movies but I feel at least they had the guts to actually place a dinosaur in San Diego; whereas I feel they are playing it too safe with this movie.

So, with the announcement of the movie imminent, I decided to tackle the book before the movie comes out. Therefore, a quick rundown of the previous movie seems appropriate. Here we go: Thomas and his friends have just escaped the relic only known as 'The Maze', where they are subjected to experimentation. They are greeted with an aggressive member of the team who followed them, and he murders one of the members. They then are 'rescued' (hint hint)....and so the first film ends and 'The Scorch Trials' begin.
