#### **Head's Corner**

The spring term has been a very busy one with a wide range of activities taking place including the wonderful BTEC dance production of Peter Pan, an inspirational Year 8 Tudor Day, residential trips to Osmington Bay, New York, and the skiing trip to La Plagne, as well as a full programme of boys' and girls' sporting fixtures, including our very first full contact girls' rugby game. Our Year 8 boys' football team has repeated last year's achievement by getting to the final of the County Cup. Fingers crossed!

As I write this article, our Performing Arts department are preparing for this year's whole school musical, the gangster comedy, Bugsy Malone, staring 96 students from the school's Performing Arts Department and the School Drama Club.

We were delighted at the very good attendance at our new subject-based consultation evenings. Parents I spoke to and who completed the online survey on the iPads welcomed the engagement with staff and the advice they received from teachers.

I was very pleased to learn recently that we will be welcoming a full year group into Year 7 for September 2014. I am delighted that Harrow Way continues to be the first choice for the majority of families in our area. We are constantly seeking to improve our school further, and have recently received a very positive report from the Local Authority about our work.

On the 24th March we were visited by our LLP (Leadership and Learning Partner) from the Local Authority – Mrs Jean Thorpe. The purpose of the annual visit was to moderate and ratify the school's self-evaluation process. The programme for the day included: Learning Walks; Analysis of Data; Student Progress; Provision for Vulnerable Students and Interviews with staff and students. It was, as you can imagine, an information-intensive day but extremely worthwhile and it was pleasing to hear her positive comments about the school.

Our Year 11 students have been working extremely hard in preparation for their forthcoming examinations, and the Easter holiday is time for them to put the finishing touches to their revision

programmes as we enter the final run-in to the examinations, which begin in earnest on Thursday 8th May. On behalf of the staff and governors, I would like to wish our Year 11 students all the very best.

The Year 9 and 10 girls from Harrow Way took on the might of Kings' School from Winchester earlier in the month in what was their first ever full contact rugby match! Having spent the past few months preparing for this, the girls approached the match itself with a great deal of optimism and positivity.

This term we have been privileged to have Lou Richie, education officer at the Hawk Conservancy Trust, come in and take our House assemblies. To each House Lou did a presentation on the bird of prey which represents their house name: Kestrels, Buzzards and Hawks. Unfortunately the Trust could not bring any of the House birds into school, but they were able to bring in a young male Barn Owl and a Tawny Owl named Troy.

At Harrow Way we take pride in our high values regarding student uniform in order to maintain good standards of dress and personal appearance which are sensible and appropriate for students at secondary school. Our school uniform policy is outlined in the student diary. This avoids inequalities of dress and extremes of fashion which are often quite unsuitable for work at school.

We believe it is important that students understand the importance of dressing suitably for school, which helps to establish a sense of community and encourage a positive working atmosphere. Students who do not follow uniform guidelines are given an opportunity to make the changes within a reasonable time frame.

Please take the opportunity, over the Easter holiday, to ensure that your son/ daughter's uniform meets the standards described in the uniform pages of the student diary. In particular, please note that the wearing of leggings, jeans-style or very tight-fitting trousers is not acceptable. Please remember that nail varnish is not permitted. Hooded tops and sweatshirts are not part of the uniform and will be confiscated for

the day if worn in school. Students are not permitted, for health and safety reasons, to wear jewellery other than one pair of small stud earrings. We are currently putting a comprehensive guide to uniform together for parents which will be available before the end of the Summer Term.

Every year we undertake an evaluation of our performance, acknowledging our successes and also identifying the areas that we need to improve.

Parental input is essential if the process is going to be truly meaningful and the evidence we collect helps to determine the priorities for the year ahead and the longer term. The information we receive from the questionnaires will be fed back to you via the school newsletter and will be discussed at Staff Meetings and Governors Committee Meetings to form the basis of the next School Improvement Plan. The National Citizen Service (NCS), the government backed youth citizenship programme, has selected Harrow Way Community School to be one of their Champion Schools for 2014. As a Champion School, Harrow Way fully embraces the NCS into their ethos. Year 11 students can join the programme which has been designed to help young people build skills for work and life, take on new challenges and meet new friends.

As you will be aware from previous communications the Government has amended key legislation relating specifically to the authorisation of leave in term time. The amendments came into force on 1 September 2013. These changes are as a result of the Education Regulations 2013. This amendment makes significant changes to the existing regulations in place since 2006.

Schools were allowed to grant students a leave of absence of up to 10 days for a family holiday in "special circumstances" and for more than 10 school days in "exceptional circumstances" during term time. From 1 September, Headteachers in any school are not able to grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are "exceptional circumstances" and this cannot be over 10 days. "Exceptional circumstances as the funeral or wedding of a close relative or representing school at county or national level. Taking students out of school for the purpose of holidays will no longer be acceptable and will not be authorised.

I hope all parents and carers will understand the limitations placed on the school in granting leave in term time. If parents and carers choose to take their children out of school without permission the new legislation may result in the potential issuing of fines under a penalty notice.

#### Staffing

Mrs Gemma Clark, one of our LSAs has left us recently, and this week we are also saying farewell to Louise Caulfield, our Librarian, who is moving to start a new life and business in Somerset. We are also saying goodbye to Kate Pyrzynska in Science and I would like to thank her for her commitment to the school over the last two terms.

Mrs Emma Brown is currently on maternity leave, and her SENCO role is being undertaken by Mrs Pat Dale. This week we have welcomed back Mrs Karen Winnett from maternity leave.

After the Easter break we will be welcoming Sara Beynon-Thomas as a Teacher of Science. We have also interviewed for Curriculum Leaders for Art, Dance and PE and have appointed Mrs Chrissy Collins, Miss Lyndsey Walker and Mr Richard Peters respectively.
