

- •Why you think your child has SEND?
- Consider whether your child learns at the same rate as other children their age?

•What support do you think your child needs?





## How will my child be supported?

INSPIRE

- CAT assessment tests will be held in September
- Reading, spelling and handwriting tests

This gives us a clear indication of needs.

- •SEND department reviews needs, shares information with teachers and puts appropriate support in place;
- Teachers: provide High Quality Inclusive Teaching in classrooms;
- •7x3 and 7y4: bespoke teaching to meet specific needs;
- Flexible Learning Centre (FLC): provides a range of interventions;
- •Teaching Assistants: run literacy, numeracy and handwriting interventions
- Outside agencies may provide support with parent permission



## How will my child be challenged?

- High quality learning in lessons
- •Student voice this year tell us:
  - All Year 7 students felt stretched
  - All Year 7 students made good or better progress

- Maths Challenge
- Bespoke curriculum activities (STEM day)
- Visits to Winchester and Oxford Universities



## How will I be involved in my child's learning?

- Primary points of contact will be form tutor and Head of year
- Student planner
- Reports from all subjects throughout academic year
- Attend parent consultation evenings to discuss progress against targets

For students with SEND:

- •SENCO will meet parents at consultation evening to discuss progress and any concerns. This will be specifically based around their SEN needs.
- Parents kept informed of interventions taking place.
- Invited to annual reviews for EHCP

- To support the Assistant Year Leader and Tutors.










## Importance of attendance.











## **Show My Homework**
