We run weekly weekday and monthly weekend volunteering sessions for adults of all ages and abilities in Harmony Wood, in neighbouring woodland to which we have management rights and at our tree and wildflower nursery. By involving the whole community in creating a resource and a legacy for Andover in the form of new urban woodland, open and accessible to all, we aim to aid the development of a sense of community and inclusivity in our expanding town.

We are at the mid-point of the 10-year woodland creation programme. On completion of the wood, planting will continue through the enhancement and creation of 'green corridors' linking Harmony Woods to other, nearby woods.



It remains a long-term aim of our project to offer a space that inspires a love of the natural world through a wide-range of creative activities, that promotes an understanding of the climate crisis and the need for environmental stewardship. One that encourages community cohesion through action that includes all, irrespective of age, ability, aptitude or ethnicity.

In addition to practical work sessions, there are seasonal events and family days throughout the year. These include a treecare day in late winter, wildflower and butterfly day in early summer and compost bagging in the autumn, culminating in the most exciting two weeks of the Andover Trees United year... Planting Fortnight for 1,000 local school children.



In 2018, this will run from the 17th to 30th November and starts on Saturday 17th with a community planting day. Our annual Pub Quiz falls on the middle weekend of planting fortnight and this year we will celebrate the winter solstice with lanterns and song.
