## Win at Army Challenge Day

A Cyber Challenge Day at the British Army's Blandford camp gave Year 10 students an insight into the role STEM plays in defence. Competing against a number of other schools, the team of eight won the challenge to solve numerous tasks in a fully immersive, AI (artificial intelligence) powered, multi-player online security training and assessment platform.

The cybersecurity training platform used for the challenge mirrors actual networks and uses real-time threat






Each team was hosted by an Army mentor as they worked their way through a number of interactive experiences which brought STEM to life while also demonstrating its importance across a breadth of roles within defence and in the Army.

Commenting on the experience Mrs Robertson said: "It is important for students to appreciate the scale of opportunity there is available to them should they choose to consider a career in one of the STEM industries. This hands-on experience has opened their eyes on a number of levels – opportunities within the Army, within engineering and within cybersecurity."
