

The Link between Teen Drugs and Violence

Over the last twenty years, substance abuse had started to decrease. However, from 2016 onward, the levels of teen and young adult usage rose again. Similarly, knife crime offences have been increasing over the past few years.



A recent incident over Christmas in London brought the total teen homicide figures to the highest recorded, overtaking 2008's twenty-nine deaths. Incidents like that, and many more minor ones happen all around the country and do not seem to be slowing down.

Though it is extremely awful and un-ideal, the statistics are not a surprise. With the coronavirus keeping leisure spaces and other activities shut up especially just after the lockdown finished - people don't want to stay at home but there are few places to go. Problems like teen violence tend to occur where there is a lack of distraction.

The two problems mentioned already also seem to be concurrent. They are extremely similar in the sense that the violence can be a result of drugs and gangs. In a small number of situations, they are completely random, however, observations and personal accounts show that being involved in drugs or gangs increases the fear of being jumped or hurt.

If anyone is struggling with situations like that,

the school should firstly be a safe refuge: if you need to talk to anyone or even a place where you can be different from how you act in the outside world

Some other techniques you could use include: talking to someone about it, either a trusted person in your life or childline; cutting all contact and changing contact information; taking up new hobbies or research with one of the many online sites designed to help.

Teen violence is a drastic problem everywhere, but if you can help stop just one act then the world will be better for it.


it perhaps a way to get constituents off his back?
