At this age, students are preparing for their future and external examinations. Every day lost puts them at a disadvantage and makes it harder for them to keep up with

their peer group. The school will be aiming to return to a 96% attendance rate but we need your support in doing this.

Students must understand that the school will be used as a reference by future employers, colleges and universities and attendance is a key part of this. The school employs an Attendance Officer who will be contacting students who fall below our expected standards.
