

Harrow Way Community School Enrichment Report

Spring Term 2023



We are passionate about and committed to offering a varied and engaging [programme of activities](#) for students at Harrow Way. This builds on a successful legacy of sports clubs and performing arts opportunities and includes a commitment to providing engaging and challenging STEM activities. KS4 students are also offered the opportunity to achieve a Duke of Edinburgh Award working with Andover Baptist Church. We have more students than ever taking part at both bronze and silver award level with several of our silver award students planning to continue to the prestigious gold award next year.

To inform accurate record keeping and ensure the health and safety of students on site after school, we trialled an electronic registration system during the Autumn term which was being successfully used across all after school enrichment activities. Year 11 revision and study activities are now recorded alongside the enrichment activities for other year groups and we were able to offer revision activities every night with an enhanced offer of sessions available. The staffing of these sessions did mean a slightly smaller amount of enrichment activities were able to run during the term for other year groups. Attendance from other year groups was further compounded by bad weather and a rise in illness. We will continue to check that attendance is being properly recorded to make that this has not added to the lower attendance at enrichment this term across most groups.

To this end, it is important that we continue to drive enrichment and encourage as many students to attend as possible. All year 7 and year 8 students are encouraged to take in at least one weekly enrichment activity and we are actively encouraging and challenging girls to take part in more STEM related opportunities.

We invite and encourage outside agencies and businesses to support and engage with activities. We [celebrate success](#) and attendance at enrichment; Heads of Year are encouraged to identify barriers to taking part with support being offered and provided to tackle issues if possible with a particular focus on SEND and disadvantaged students.

Amongst the numerous activities and outcomes from Stem clubs, students have now completed the construction of a go-kart and successfully tested and raced this at Thruxton race circuit. Performing arts students gave several performances including a successful week of school musical show 'Spaced: The Musical'

Action Points:

- Explore with students reason for fall in enrichment attendance during Spring Term
