

# STOP TALKING START PLANTING

## Our Academies

**WHAT:** One-day workshop for children aged 10 -12 on the topics of the climate crisis, global citizenship and distributive justice.

**HOW:** Peers inform participants about the causes and consequences of the climate crisis and inspire other children to join in.

**GOAL:** The children learn what each individual can achieve, learn to give presentations, plant trees together and plan their first own actions. Everyone receives an Ambassador package with books and flyers. With this, the children and their parents can inform themselves further and become active members.

**ACHIEVED SO FAR:** Since 2008, more than 91,000 children have been trained as Ambassadors for Climate Justice in approximately 1600 Academies in 75 countries around the world.

This is what an Academy day looks like in detail:

- The Ambassador Talk: 30-minute talk by an already trained Climate Justice Ambassador about CO<sub>2</sub>, tree planting and Plant-for-the-Planet.
- The World Game: The children playfully learn about the connections between distributive justice and global citizenship and discuss this topic together.
- The Rhetoric Training: The participants receive important information on the topics of rhetoric and feedback and give a short presentation in front of small groups.
- The Planting Party: Under the guidance of a forester or gardening specialist, the children go outside and plant their first trees by themselves.
- The World Café/ Work in School Groups: The children plan and visualise their first projects that they want to implement in their school, family, or community.
- The Final Presentation: The children present their plans to the adults, receive their information package and certificate and are appointed as Climate Justice Ambassadors.
