Headteacher Introduction



Welcome to this year's edition of The Eagle. We hope you enjoy this celebration of another remarkable year at Harrow Way Community School - a chance to reflect on the many achievements, experiences and memorable moments that have shaped the 2025-26 academic year. What a year it has been!

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Our School Pledge reminds us that an exceptional education extends far beyond the classroom. Our extensive enrichment programme continues to provide experiences that develop character, broaden horizons and equip our young people with the knowledge, confidence and skills they will need in later life. I am immensely grateful to our staff, whose commitment and generosity make these opportunities possible, from the wide range of clubs and activities to educational visits and residential such as Iceland, Barcelona and Manor Adventures.

We are also fortunate to work alongside organisations that enrich our curriculum. This year, for example, Newbury Building Society delivered engaging workshops on mortgages and financial management, while the

national charity PrepT coordinated unforgettable opportunities for students to experience the Michelin-starred kitchen at Lainston House Hotel. Experiences such as these inspire ambition and help our students see the exciting possibilities that lie ahead.

Alongside these opportunities, we have continued to invest in our learning environment. The refurbishment of our student bathrooms has made a significant difference to the daily experience of students, and we are hopeful that planning permission for the long-awaited covered area on the field will be granted by the end of July, allowing work to begin later this year.

This term has also seen the exciting transformation of C Block into our new Resourced Provision. Our new modular building is now fully operational, providing enhanced facilities for the Modern Languages department and a new home for The Link. We now look forward to welcoming the first students into the Resourced Provision when it opens in September.

In keeping with our school's longstanding connection to the historic Harrow Way, we have chosen the name The Waypoint. It reflects both our heritage and our vision for inclusive education. A waypoint is a place where travellers regain their bearings before continuing their journey - a fitting metaphor for the support we aspire to provide. Above all, it reflects our belief that inclusion is not about creating separate pathways, but about ensuring every young person is able to thrive as a valued member of our school community.

Another noticeable change from September will be our new school uniform. Following consultation with our community, we look forward to seeing students in Years 7 to 10 wearing the new polo shirt and jumper, while Year 11 students will have the option to adopt the new uniform if they wish. We believe the revised uniform is not only smarter and more comfortable, allowing students to focus fully on their learning, but also more affordable, helping to reduce the financial burden on families. From September, students will also be permitted to wear plain

black trainers.

To our students, families and staff, thank you for your unwavering support, encouragement and trust throughout the year. It is a privilege to lead this wonderful community. Schools are built on relationships. While Harrow Way has many strengths, it is the trust, kindness and shared ambition between students, families and staff that enables our community to flourish.

As the year draws to a close, we also say a fond farewell to colleagues who are moving on to new opportunities. Some are relocating with their families, while others have secured well-deserved promotions. Although

we are sorry to see them leave, we thank them sincerely for their contribution to Harrow Way and wish them every success in the future. They will always remain part of our school community.

We look forward to welcoming everyone back in September. Wednesday 2 September will be dedicated to our new Year 7 students as they begin their secondary school journey, alongside our Year 11 students taking part in the reward trip to Thorpe Park. The whole school returns on Thursday 3 September at 8.40am.

Finally, may I take this opportunity to thank everyone who has contributed to another successful year at Harrow

Way Community School. I hope you enjoy reading this edition of The Eagle, and I wish all our students, families and staff a restful, enjoyable and well-deserved summer break.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

We would like to remind you about our updated school uniform policy, which comes into effect from 1st September 2026.

- Students will continue to wear black trousers or tartan skirts.
- Blazers, ties and white shirts will no longer be required; instead, students will wear a grey polo shirt, which was introduced as part of our summer uniform two years ago.
- We are introducing a green jumper with the Harrow Way logo, to be worn with the polo shirt.
- Plain black trainers will be allowed on the condition that there are no visible logos.

These changes apply to Years 7-10, Year 11 students may choose either to wear the new uniform or continue wearing the previous uniform for their final year.

The following are important reminders:

- Black trousers must have a waistband, zip and/or pockets and must not be skin-tight. Leggings, including flared leggings, are not permitted.
- Trainers must be completely black, including the soles and any logos.
- Facial piercings are not permitted. If your child is considering having a nose piercing during the summer holiday, please bear in mind that nose studs (including clear retainers) may not be worn in school from September.
- Students may wear one small stud earring in each ear only.
- Socks should be plain black or plain white.
- False nails and false eyelashes are not permitted.
- From September, smart watches will no longer be permitted in school. As an extension of a mobile phone, they will be subject to the same expectations as mobile devices.

The programme concluded with an unforgettable visit to Lainston House Hotel in Winchester, where students experienced first-hand what it takes to operate a luxury five-star hotel. They toured the hotel's departments, met staff from across the business and gained valuable insight into the many exciting careers available within the hospitality industry.

Students also explored Lainston House's beautiful kitchen garden, learning about seasonal produce, sustainability and ethical sourcing before harvesting fresh ingredients to cook alongside the hotel's talented chefs. The day ended with everyone sitting down together to enjoy the delicious dishes they had prepared—a wonderful way to celebrate everything they had learned throughout the programme.
